Iwan Azis is Professor of Emerging Markets within the Dyson School of Applied Economics and Management, Cornell University, and was the Director of Graduate Studies, Regional Science program (2005-2010). He is also Visiting Professor at the University of Indonesia. Awarded "Distinguished Scholar in Regional Science, Financial Economics, and Economic Modeling," his research focuses on the interlink between macro-financial economics, social-institutional issues, and spatial inequalities in emerging markets. He has been advising the Indonesian Central Bank and the Deposit Insurance Corporation on their research, and is a member of International Advisory Panel of the Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB). He has published several
